# Slavey Words to Learn for Kids or Beginners (as taken from A Grammar of Slave by Keren Rice)

For this year, I will be learning from the module, A Grammar of Slave by Keren Rice, which was published in 1989 of the Slavey language that consists of research and stufy of all the dialects in the Northwest Territories. This includes from Hare, Bearlake, Mountain, and Slavey (often called southern Slavey). Hare, Bearlake and Mountain are sometimes grouped together as northern Slavey.

This newsletter will focus more on Mountain slavey, as well as bits of Bearlake thrown in.

This issue would only have the basics of what I learned and some of the dialects explained. Slave is a term used for the language spoken in the following communities: Fort Liard, Fort Providence, Hay River, Kakisa, Jean Marie River, Trout Lake, Nahanni Butte, Fort Simpson, Wrigley, Fort Norman, Fort Franklin, Fort Good Hope, and Coville Lake in the NT, Meander River and Chateh in Albert, and Fort Nelson in BC. Remember, this was written in 1989 but the language would not change as much as it would a hundred years ago.

Slavey, or Dene, is a language of the Athapaskan language family spoken by the people in the Mackenzie River area of the NT, Canada. Many people recognize lexical items from neighbouring communities, although they themselves do not use them. There is a lot of variations between each dialect, such as in the Hare and Mountain, the word final (h) is usually lost in speaking, although this (h) is maintained in compounds (when two words are put together). For example, sah/sa for bear and sahwé for bearskin. The (h) is not spoken when we say bear but it is there when we say bearskin.

There is also variation by age factors as well, younger speakers often show a greater tendency towards contraction and loss of morphemes. 
Another example of variation is that in Hare, the optative has been generalized to a future tense, while the other dialects mark the future by a post verbal clitic 'gha.'

- Sộbakộé gots'é ?awohdee (Hare)
- Sộbakộé gots'é ?awohdee gha (Bearlake)
- "I am going to go to Yellowknife."

#### Basic Word Order

A sentence in Slave consists minimally of a verb.

- goyidee "She talked." (Hare, Bearlake)



- t'eere goyidee "The girl talked." (Hare, Bearlake)



Sentences can also include object nouns or noun phrases. The word order is Subject-Object-Verb.

- setá ?įts'é whehk'é "My dad shot a moose." (Bearlake) (dad) (moose) (shot)
- Oblique object nouns occur between the subject and the direct object. The basic word order is Subject-Oblique Object-Direct Object-Verb. (Oblique: noting or pertaining to any case of noun inflection except nominative and vocative.)
  - ?ehkee t'eere ghá tsá nị?o "The boy gave the girl a hat." (Hare) (Boy) (girl) (for) (hat) (gave)

I will write about Nouns and Verbs in the next issues of the newsletter. We will take this journey together on learning Slavey and how to read and write it hopefully.


# The Dangers of Alcohol in the Human System

The holidays are a fun time to celebrate and there is time off from work for many and with the winter road open, that means that there is going to be more trips for alcohol and other related activities. Due to Christmas and New Years, many people will go down to the Wells to pick up rations to celebrate with and that means the possibility of bootlegging as well. There is no judgement when it comes to celebrating but many families will suffer from those who drink to excess and press their present onto others and their families. Alcohol should not be around

children and those who do not drink. Many people experience parties going to their house, sometimes in the middle of the night or even in the middle of the day. It is okay to party and celebrate but in moderation. Have someone you trust with you to take away the bottle when vou become someone else entirely. The point is crossed when children are present and witness grown adults acting funny or angry when things do not go their way. This picture would stay with them for many years and they would see that person differently from then on. You must remember that children build their own image of themselves and your image from that age and it will be how



they see you from now on. Do you want to be known as the person to avoid or the person to not talk to when they see you on the road? Alcohol for the brief moment makes you not care and see the world differently but that is only for the moment and not a lifestyle. It will slowly damage your organs, your brain, your ability to do things, and your image in the town. Getting help is not a death sentence but a decision you make for yourself to see the future better. Here is a few examples and questions you need to ask yourself if alcohol is affecting you too much. Can you remember the last couple of years? Are you able to move your body like you used to do? Is your mind the same as before? Or is it slower or lacking in the ability to think as quickly? Does it take



more and more alcohol to feel any effects? If you go for a long time without drinking, do you immediately go into withdrawals? In the last couple of years, what did you achieve that you are proud of? It doesn't have to be anything big like finishing a course or winning a big prize. It could be simple things like finishing that book or tv show that you were putting off. How much time did you spend with your family? What do you think of what kind of memories do they have of you? Is it kindness and visiting? Or is it parties and yelling? This newsletter is not to judge but to help anything who reads

this of a sign they have been waiting for to slow down on their drinking, quit, or think of anything else that would help with their intake of alcohol.


