Slavey Words to Learn for Kids or Beginners (as taken from A Grammar of Slave by Keren Rice)

Nouns: Nouns functions as subjects and objects of verbs or postpositions (a small word that shows a relationship between two nouns, e.g., an essay *on* linguistics, or a verb and a noun, e.g., to write *about* linguistics). Some examples:

Tlį - "dog." Yah - "snow." Nahxį - "snowblindness."

A noun phrase can consist of a noun alone.

```
Lį yįsee – "The dog barked." (Hr)
```

Lidį hehtsį – "I am making tea." (Bl, Sl, Mt)

A noun can be possessed, either by a possessive pronoun or by another noun. The pronouns are underlined.

```
Sekwí ?eyá – "My head hurts."
```

(head) (hurts)

```
Cheekua mehchiné – "The boy's truck."
```

```
(boy) (truck)
```

A noun phrase can contain modifiers of various types:

Tse lq – "Lots of wood." (Bl, Sl, Mt) (wood)(lots)

A noun can be modified by a sentence or clause. In some dialects, such sentences are marked with a relative complementizer í.

```
?eká hịshá í – "The big boat." (Hr)
(boat)3(is big) COMP
```

A sentence can function as a noun phrase, serving as a subject or object. These complement sentences are marked by complementizers ni, gú, and gha in some dialects.

```
Mary le gòhli rágwee ni kodihsho - "I know that Mary is living in Norman Wells."
(n.wells)3(stays)(comp)(know it)
```

Postpositions: Postpositions in Slave express relationships such as place, time, direction, manner, and accompaniment. A postpositional phrase consists of an object, generally a pronoun, noun or noun phrase, followed by a postposition. Some examples of postpositional phrases are shown:

```
Dene hé – "With the man."
(man)(with)
Kộé gots'ę́ – "To the house."
(house)(area to)
```

Postpositional phrases come between the subject and the direct object.

Mary Joe gah ke ehtsi - "Mary is making slippers for Joe." (Bl, Sl, Mt.) (for)(slipper)(is making)

When the object of a postposition is a pronoun, the postpositional phrase is often attracted to the verb. Mary ke megha ethsi - "Mary is making slippers for him." (slippers)(for)3(is making)

Verbs: The verb in Slave is complex. It consists of a theme, or a basic lexical entry, and some number of additional prefixes. The theme includes the stem, a classifier (expressing voice), and any other prefixes that are obligatorily part of the verb word. The nonthematic prefixes express person, number, aspect, and mode (distinctions of time and manner), and adverbial concepts, among others. The basic structure of the verb is shown below. The number indicate verb prefix positions.

00 Object of postposition	5 number	10 Conjugation
1 Incorporated postposition	6 Direct object	11 Mode
2 Adverb	7 Deictic subject	12 Subject
3 Distributive	8 Theme	13 Classifier
4 Incorporated stem	9 Aspect	stem

Intransitive Verb: are those which cannot take a direct object. Some examples:

```
Lu dézee - "The ice is running." (Hr)
(ice)3(started to flow)
Deeho tádatę - "The river is frozen." (Hr)
(river)3(is frozen)
```

When the subject is a pronoun rather than a noun, a pronominal subject prefix in the verb, underlined in the examples below, there is not usually an independent person.

E<u>hji</u> - "I sing." (Sl, Bl, Mt) <u>Neji</u> - "You sing." Eji - "s/he sings."
