<u>Yes/No Questions</u>: There are three ways of forming yes/no questions in slave. First, the word $s\dot{u}$ (Hare), $s\dot{i}$ (Slavey, Mountain), $2 a s \dot{i}$ (Bearlake) may occur, usually sentence-initially.

Many kids all over the Northwest Territories participated and all placed in different categories, ages, and genders. We hope many new records were broken and that Yellowknife was a great place to


visit and shop at for all the kids who probably went to the movies,






