Slavey Words to Learn for Kids or Beginners (as taken from A Grammar of Slave by Keren Rice, 1989) (Hr-Hare, Bl-Bearlake, Sl-Slavey, Mt-Mountain)

Mountain Dialect:

a. *p, kw*. The labial series varies with the labiovelar series in Fort Nomran Mountain. In Wrigley Mountain only the labial series occurs.

ʔepojire ʔekwojire “Rotten wood.”

ʔevéh ʔewéh “Hide.”

P’ih kw’ih “Mosquito.”

b. *m, b*. In prefixes, there is some variation between [b], found in Hare and Bearlake, and [m], found in Slavey. The nasals are more common in Wrigley Mountain and there is considerable variation in Fort Norman Mountain.

Behchiné mehchiné “Sled.”

Beyaa meyaa “His/her son.”

c. *d, nd; b, mb*. In Mountain, there is variation between the prenasalized stop, characteristic of Slavey, and the regular stop, characteristic of Bearlake and Hare.

Ndn du “Island.”

-ndaá -daá “Eye.”

Mbeh beh “Knife.”

Did you know? For hunting techniques, the Dogribs dressed as caribous and walked into a herd without suspicion and picked the fattest caribou. When they struck, it caused confusion among the herd, allowing them to strike more. – The People of Denendeh, pg. 69-70.

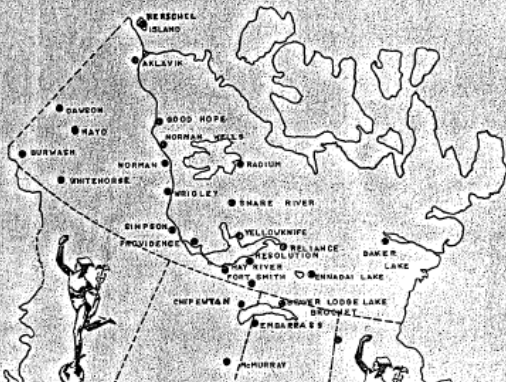

Did you know? In 1873, the North West Mounted Police was formed in Canada, renamed Royal North West Mounted Police in 1904, and in 1920 the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. “Almost immediately this police force became highly respected by both whites and Indians, and it prevented the Canadian West from becoming as wild and as lawless as its American counterpart.” – As Long as This Land Shall Last: A History of Treaty 8 and Treaty 11, pg. 4.

A History Of The Northwest Territories And Yukon Radio System



1930

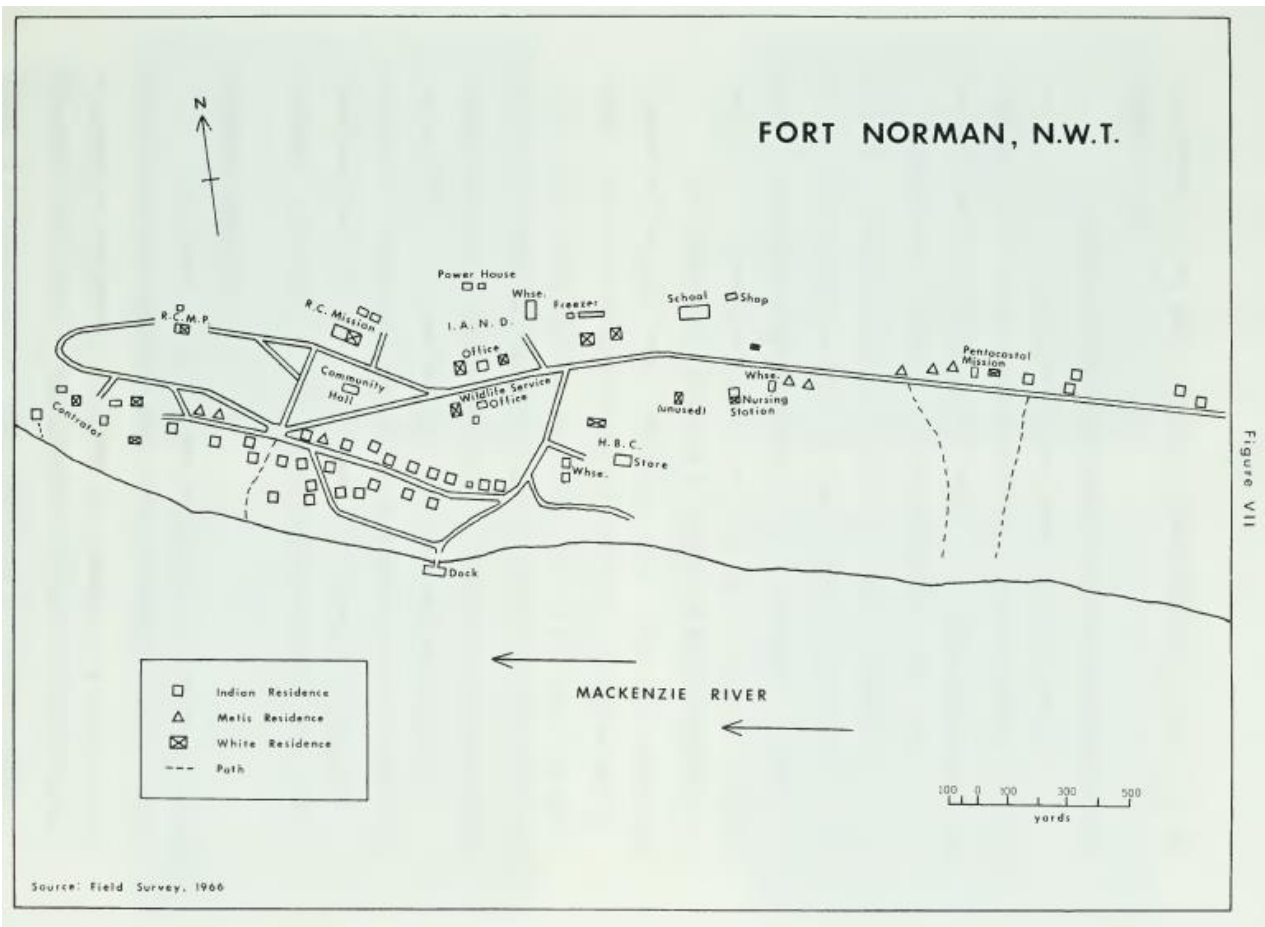
Fort Norman was chosen as the next link in the NWT&Y chain and went on the air 15th August 1930. Norman is situated on the north bank of the Mackenzie River (which at this point flows almost east-west) at the confluence of the Mackenzie and Great Bear Rivers, a natural junction

point on the water route to Great Bear Lake where important mineral discoveries were being made. The location was also important from a meteorological standpoint as it was approximately mid-way on the 800 mile stretch between the Radio Stations at Fort Simpson and Aklavik and regular weather reports from here would greatly assist the Met Dept to produce more accurate forecasts to assist commercial aircraft operations which were expanding rapidly all over the north. This station was opened by S Sgt Pat Coombes, L cpl "Gander" Beckett and Sig Sid McAuley.

Did you know? The first plane flight in the NWT was from Edmonton to Tulita, NT due to Imperial Oil and the oil strike? As Long as This Land Shall Last: A History of Treaty 8 and Treaty 11, pg. 197.

The North West Company built Fort Norman on the right bank of Mackenzie River, nearly opposite Redstone River, in or before 1810. It has been suggested that it may have been built as early as 1804 because Fort of the Forks (established in 1803 (*qv*)) and Fort Good Hope (established in 1804 (*qv*)) were about 725 km apart, and it would have been

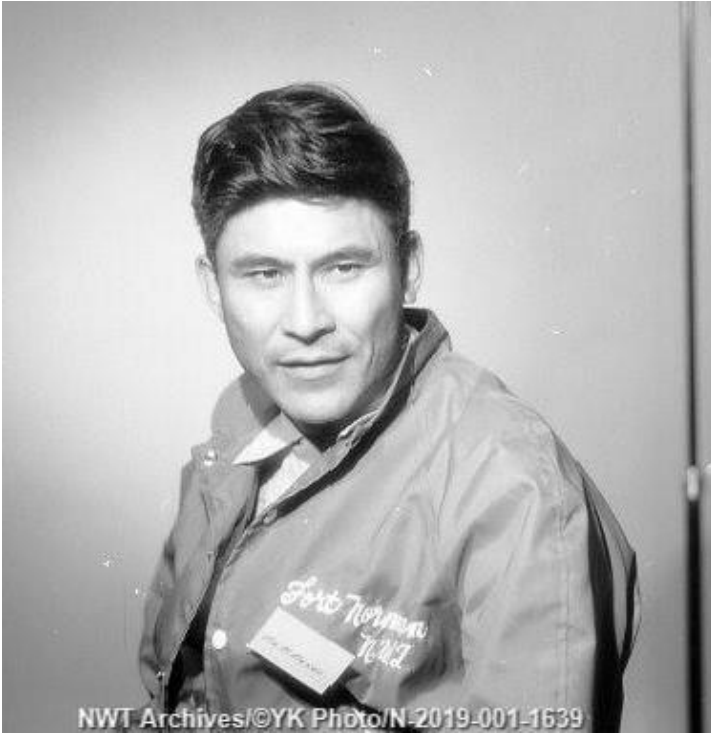

logical to have a post between them. In common with other posts on Mackenzie River, it was closed in 1815 and reopened about 1821. In 1823, when Fort Good Hope was moved about 160 km downstream, Fort Norman was also moved to a site about 50 km south of Great Bear River to accommodate Hare Indians, who had until then traded at Fort Good Hope. In 1851, it was moved to its present site on the right bank near the mouth of Great Bear River and has operated ever since.

- 1815 Abandonment of
 Mackenzie River

Prior to 1815, the North West Company's trade in the Mackenzie district declined, for reasons that W. F. Wentzel ascribed to mismanagement. In 1815, no longer able to meet the expenses of the district, the company evacuated all its posts: Fort of the Forks (see 1803), Fort Good Hope (see 1804), Great Bear Lake post (see c 1800), and Fort Norman (see c 1810). Fort Nelson (see 1805, Fort Liard) had already been destroyed by Indians in 1813. The Hudson's Bay Company had no posts in Mackenzie River district, so there were no European traders in the region at all for a short time, a fact that caused hardship and anger among the Indians. In 1816, however, Wentzel canoed as far as Fort Good Hope with a small supply of trade goods, and promised the Indians that he would try to have the posts re-established. In 1817, Charles Grant made a similar trading voyage downstream and obtained good returns. He possibly established Fort Alexander during this journey (see 1817). By 1818, the company had returned to the region and, by 1820, three posts operated: Fort Alexander, Fort Good Hope, and Fort Nelson. Fort of the Forks and Fort Norman—but not Great Bear Lake post—were reoccupied in or about 1821.
