Kerri McPherson is teaching art classes at the Chief Albert Wright School with the Grades 5, 6, & 7 kids. We went over different techniques, how to sketch vs. finished drawings, and how to draw lightly, so that you can erase any mistakes.



We had practice papers to sketch over, questions answered, and giggles over designs and sketches. They were taught how the first sketch will not always be the best, that practice is the best tool, and everyone goes at their own pace.

They looked through Kerri's sketchbooks to see how the processes were done with pencils, pens, inks, pencil crayons, markers, and paint.

We hope to continue with more art classes in the future!



<u> Medicinal Mushrooms – Shaggy Mane</u>

Other names: Lawyer's wig, inky cap.

Description: *Cap* – Elongated oval cap, with brown scales on top; turns black from bottom up. *Gills* – Crowded and free, white to pink. *Stalk* – White, thick but hollow partial veil. *Size* – to 10cm (4") across and to 12cm (4.75") high. *Spore Print* – Black.

Habitat: Grassy areas, fields, ditches.

Medicinal Uses: In traditional Chinese medicine, shaggy mane is used to improve digestion and relieve hemorrhoids. It should be picked before it turns dark and bitter, it does not have a long shelf life unless dried early and properly. If left on the counter, may liquify into a dark inky paste. It is considered a gourmet edible and a favourite among



mushroom pickers. There is a similar mushroom, Coprinopsis, that if consumed with alcohol, may have adverse reactions. Copsin, a protein in this mushroom, kills various bacteria by binding to an essential cell wall building block. Its activity is unique, in that most traditional antibiotics are non-protein. One study found that the mushroom lowered blood



sugar levels in diabetics. Other research found that mushroom extracts induce apoptosis in ovarian cancer (ES-2) cells, via extrinsic and intrinsic pathways. Gastric cancer cells lines also show induced apoptosis. Prostate cancer enlargement and cancers may benefit from shaggy mane, as it contains a natural anti-acetylcholinesterase activity, comparable to the drug donepezil.

Notes: The spore-rich ink of this species was used during World War 1 and 2 to protect and identify secret messages sent by spies.

Caution: May aggravate symptoms of those with eczema or atopic dermatitis.

PLEASE DO NOT START PICKING MUSHROOMS OR PLANTS THAT YOU ARE NOT FAMILIAR WITH AS MANY HAVE SIMILAR LOOKS BUT CAN BE MORE DANGEROUS TO YOUR HEALTH. CHECK WITH YOUR LOCAL PICKERS AND ELDERS WHO HAVE MORE EXPERIENCE WITH DEALING WITH MUSHROOMS AND PLANTS.

Medicical Plants - Fireweed

Other names: Also known as bay willow-herb, bay willow, blooming Sally, burntweed, deerhorn, firetop, flowering willow, French willow herb, grand willow-herb, herb wickopy, Indian wickup, Persian willow, pilewort, Sally-bloom, spiked willow-herb, wild asparagus, and willow-weed.

Habitat: In open sites, including woods and recently burned areas, and along roadsides.

Edible Uses: Fireweed leaves, high in vitamins A and C, can be eaten raw or cooked. It is high in iron, copper, potassium, and calcium. The flowers add a zest of color and taste to a fresh salad. The cooked leaves have been considered a good green potherb. Dried mature leaves are





used to make fireweed tea, which is enjoyed around the world. The stems can be peeled and eaten raw. The root can be roasted after scraping off the outside, but often tastes bitter. To mitigate this, the root is collected before the plant flowers and the brown thread in the middle removed. The stem centers can also be prepared by splitting the outer stalk, and eaten raw.

Medicinal Uses: The roots and leaves have been used in treating diarrhea, eczema, and sore throat. The roots have been made into a poultice or ointment that has been used to treat boils, ulcers, rashes, and

other skin disorders. This plant has also been reported to relieve the pain of diseased mucous membranes, colon troubles, cholera, and dysentery. Fireweed is considered antiscorbutic, astringent, antispasmodic, demulcent, and emmenagogue. The fireweed can be added to dogs' food. It can treat pus-filled boils or cuts by placing a piece of the raw stem on the afflicted area. It is said to draw the pus out of the cut or boil and prevents the cut with pus in it from healing over too quickly.

Precautions: Some individuals have found this species to have a slight laxative effect. **Notes**: Fireweed is a spectacular common wildflower that is well-known as a colonizer of burned areas. It spreads rapidly, changing a blackened landscape into an amazing sea of pink within just a few months.
