Slavey Words to Learn for Kids or Beginners (as taken from A Grammar of Slave by Keren Rice) (Hr-Hare, Bl-Bearlake, Sl-Slavey, Mt-Mountain)

Vowel Correspondences: In general, vowels are identical in all dialects. There are some exceptions to this statement, however. In Wrigley Mountain, the vowel [i] is found where [u] occurs in other dialects.

The words in the second column under Bearlake above are examples of Dogrib Bearlake. In Dogrib, *u* is generally fronted to *i* (except in the environment of a velar). Forms like those in the first column are used by Bearlake and Hare-origin people while forms like those in the second column are used by Dogrib-origin Bearlake people. Variation between the vowels [e] and [o] also occurs and is controlled by the same factor.

In a few nouns there is variation between the vowels [u] and [i] in all dialects.

This vowel variation seems to be due to an historical factor, a reflection of an optional rounding of *i* to *u* before *w*.

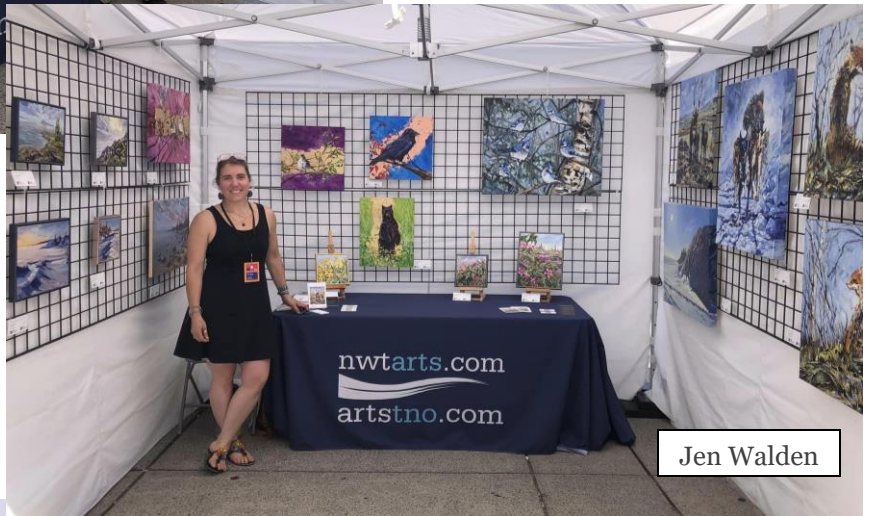

10am to 7pm, the NWT Artists greeted visitors and promoted their work, and for some, works were sold. Many of the visitors asked questions about the Northwest Territories once

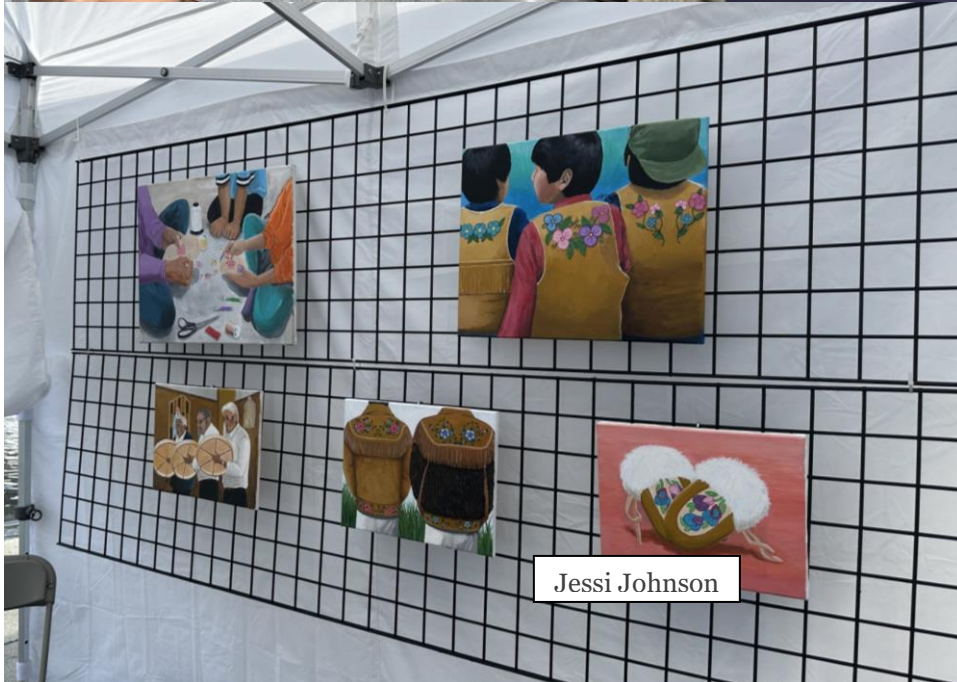

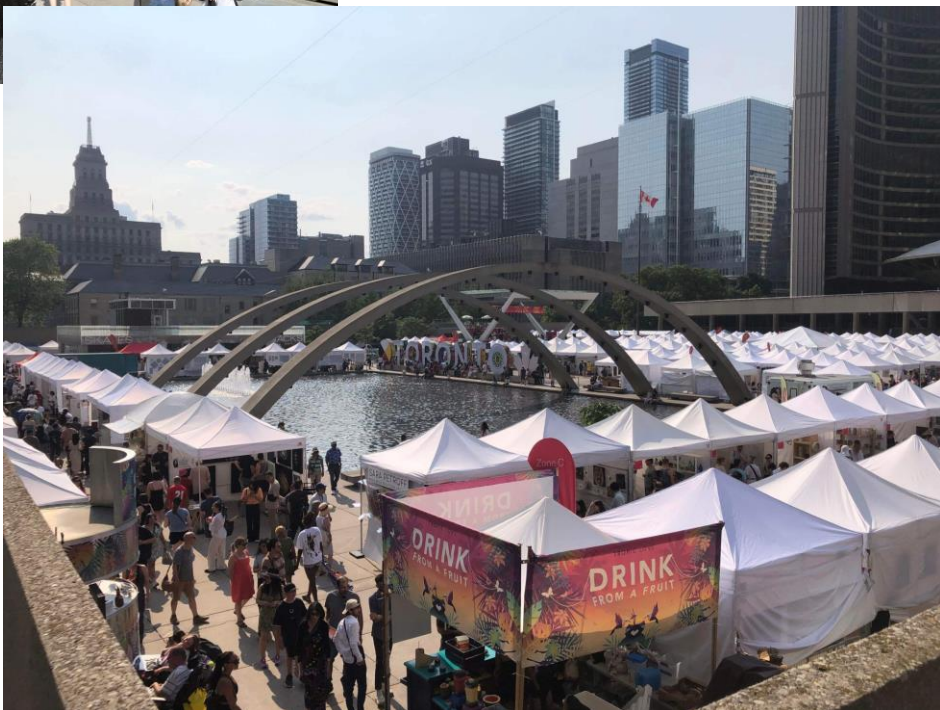

Tulita History Corner

Here are a few daily post journals that were taken from the Post Journal of William Mowat (unsure if he written it but it was written that he worked there during these years) during the years 1837 to 1838. The quotes are written as how it was originally printed.

Saturday, July 1st, 1837

- “at a leate our the Expedition Brigade arrived, three boats and two canoes. Mr. Chief Factor Dise and Mr. Thomas Simpson put up ther Tents for the night. they Came from Fort Simpson to this Place In Two days. The Boats was anchored out from the land and the officers went to bed as well as their Soldiers, Etatille and Cule Land arrived with a few furs that is not taken account of as they arrived at a late our, 7 fish from the nets.”

Monday, July 3rd, 1837

- “Wind ENE but fine and warm. Etsamba went to Fort Simpson with a scyth that was taken down in a mistake. St.arnaud set nets in Every direction and brought 10 fish for Supper, they water fall off Quick how and I hope well get a few fish, no arrivals today.”

Thursday, July 6th, 1837

- “Wind ESE with agell as very afen happen In this part of the globe, the nets afforded 6 Fish, the Indians Suffer now as much in winter, all Speak of going to the Deer Lands, wher they ar Like Kings.”

Monday, July 10th, 1837

- “a fine warm day and the Miskilus very annyin, the man down the River with the nets, and brought 8 Fish. The Indians remark that their will be no Fish this summer, So far it is Too True, our Potates and Barley is Not so far advance as In former years at this deat.”

Tuesday, July 11th, 1837

- “Two of the Seven Brothers arrived. they brought as follows viz 40 lbs Fresh Meat. 100 dry Fish, that they Traded for ammunition, and went off down the River, a very warm day.”

Thursday, July 13th, 1837

- *“Two Lads arrived, they brought only 17 small Fish, the man finished the Potate howing. 14 fish from the nets, our Fort Hunters Is very long absent no Change in the weather.”*

Friday, July 14th, 1837

- *“Petit Blanch Two Sons arrived they brought as follows viz 70 lbs Fresh Meat, 10 Musquash, that they Traded for ammunition and off they went to Clark Roks. That Is Their Summer haul. In winter they go to the Bears Lake Fish village, St. arnaud went off with the nets last night brought 17 Small white fish this morning. Cloudy weather.”*

Thursday, July 20th, 1837

- *“I was down the River as far as Piche de Chival. In search of a Convenient Spot to remove the Establishment to. but there is no good place as the Banks is. Too high to morrow I Shall go up the River, 11 fish.”*

Friday, July 21st, 1837

- *“Went up the River as far as Old Fort toke Supper their after visiting Every Creek on the west Side of the River wher I found one fine Point, but Too far from the water, we came down a small Pice and Encamp for the night.”*

Tuesday, July 25th, 1837

- *“Three Indians arrived from willow Lake, they brought as folows viz Six Made Beaver in Furs, 59 dry Fish they gote a small suply of ammunition and went off. St. arnaud began to mud the beuldins, the nets afforded 40 Fishes to day, the water rose much Last night.”*

Wednesday, July 26th, 1837

- *“Two Indians arrived from So Corpes Camp; brought nothing gave them a few lods of gun powder and they went to the opposit Little Lake, 60 Fish from the nets.”*

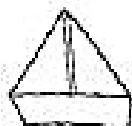

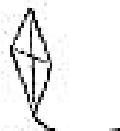
