4.5 Intonation

Intonation features mark different sentence types.

4.5.1 Declaratives

In declaratives, there is falling intonation at the end of a sentence.

- (78) a. deyehwī̃ 'I am hungry' (Hr)
b. chq̃ denáíē̃ 'it is starting to rain' (BI)
rain 3 starts to fall
c. ts'òdani kare náokeyéē̃ 'the children play outside' (BI)
child outside 3pl. play

In Hare, a verb stem vowel is often reduced or is lost entirely in a declarative, with frequent lengthening of the stem-initial consonant when the stem-initial is a sibilant.

- (79) a. léht'édóné hehsj̃ 's/he is making bread'
bread 3 makes
[léht'édóné? hehs̃̃]
b. ráwóhsha 'I am going to go'
[ráwóhsh̃̃]
c. ts'òdani rágokeyee 'the children are playing'
child 3pl. play
[ts'òdani ráokezh̃̃]
d. ?edehtl'é 'I am writing'
[?edehtl'̃̃]

4.5.2 Yes/no questions

When the yes/no question particle *ʔasí* (B1)/*sí* (S1, Mt)/*sú* (Hr) occurs, sentence-final intonation is falling.

- (80) a. *sú sɔdi hɪ́ɪ* 'is s/he happy?' (Hr)
 Q happy 3 is
 b. *ʔasí yúkɔ́ godádeɪ́ʔa* 'is the store closed?' (B1)
 Q store 3 is closed

A second way of forming yes/no question exists, rising intonation. See chapter 36 for discussion of the semantic differences between question types. Vowel lengthening frequently accompanies rising intonation.

- (81) a. *sɔdi hɪ́ɪ* 'is s/he happy?'
 happy 3 is
 [sɔdi hɪ́ɪ́], [sɔdi hɪ́ɪ́́]
 b. *téht'ée wɛnehtsɪ́* 'you sg. made bread?'
 bread 2sg. made
 [téht'ée wɛnehtsɪ́́], [téht'ée wɛnehtsɪ́́́]

When the verb stem has a high tone, the vowel is usually lengthened.

- (82) *báyiidá* 'I saw him/her' (B1)
 báyeenedá 'you sg. saw him/her'
 báyeenedáá 'did you sg. see him/her?'

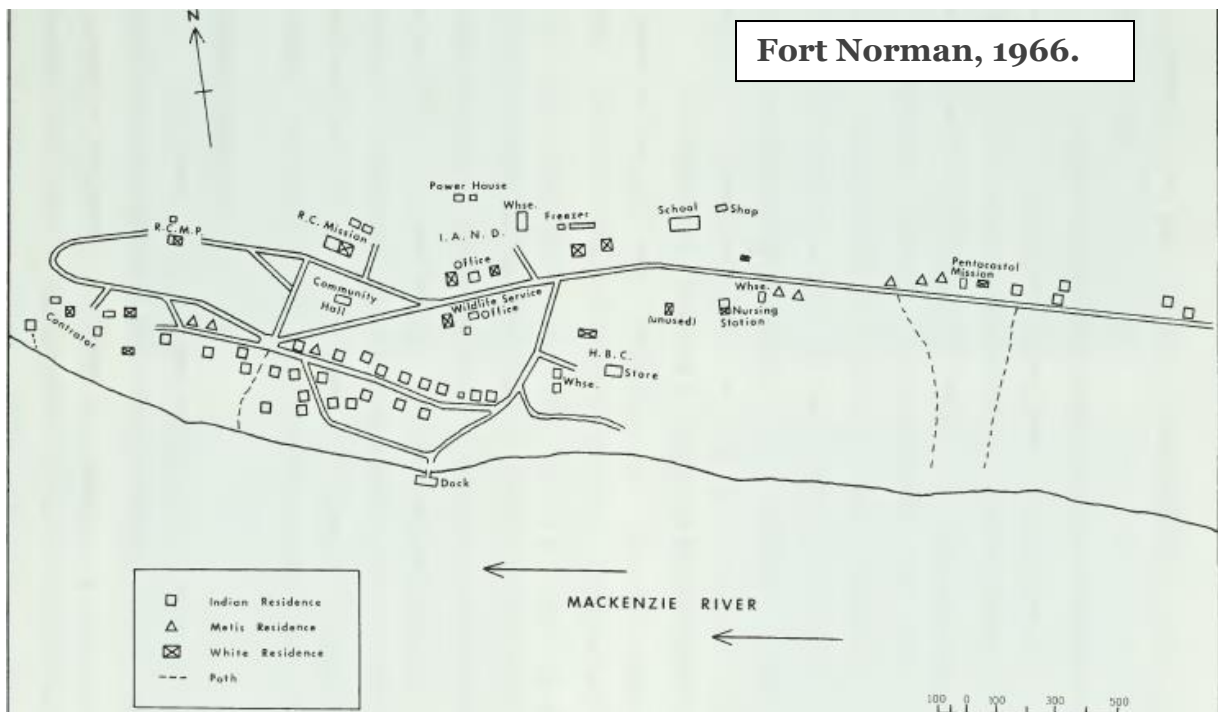

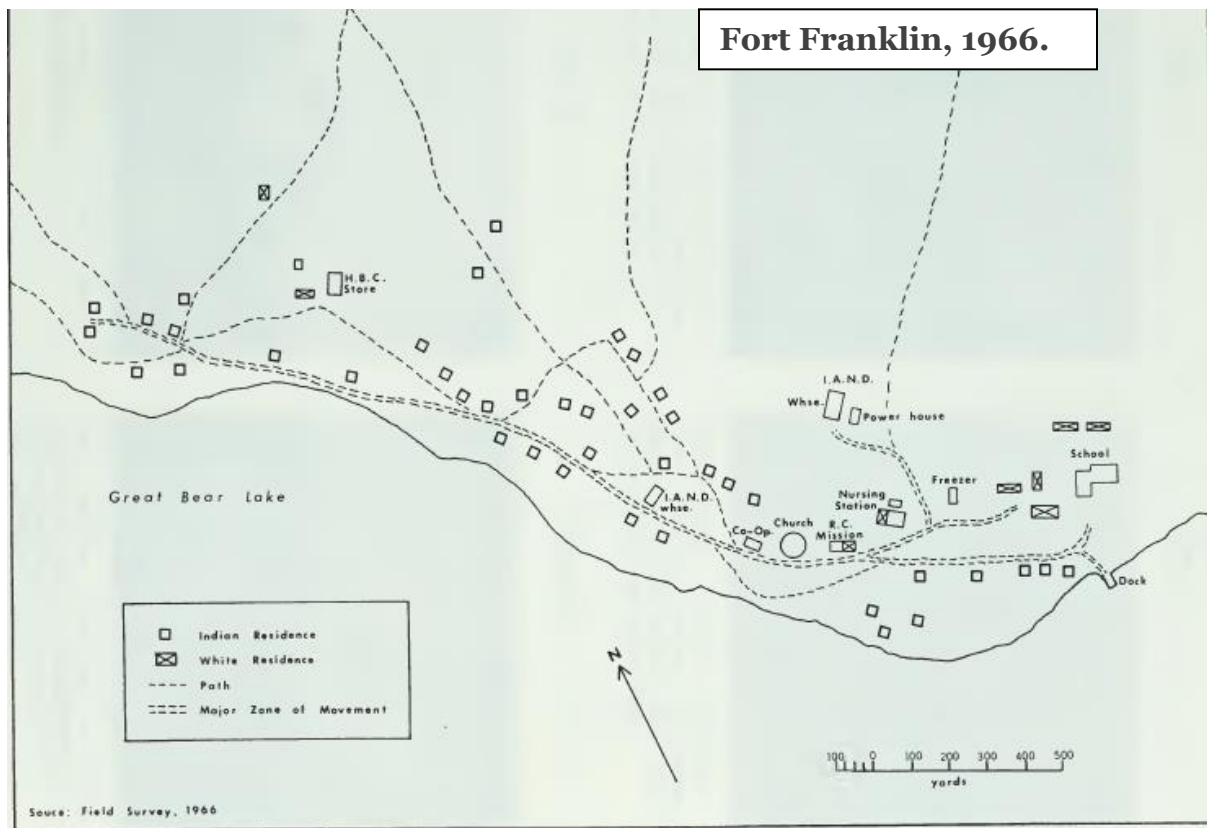

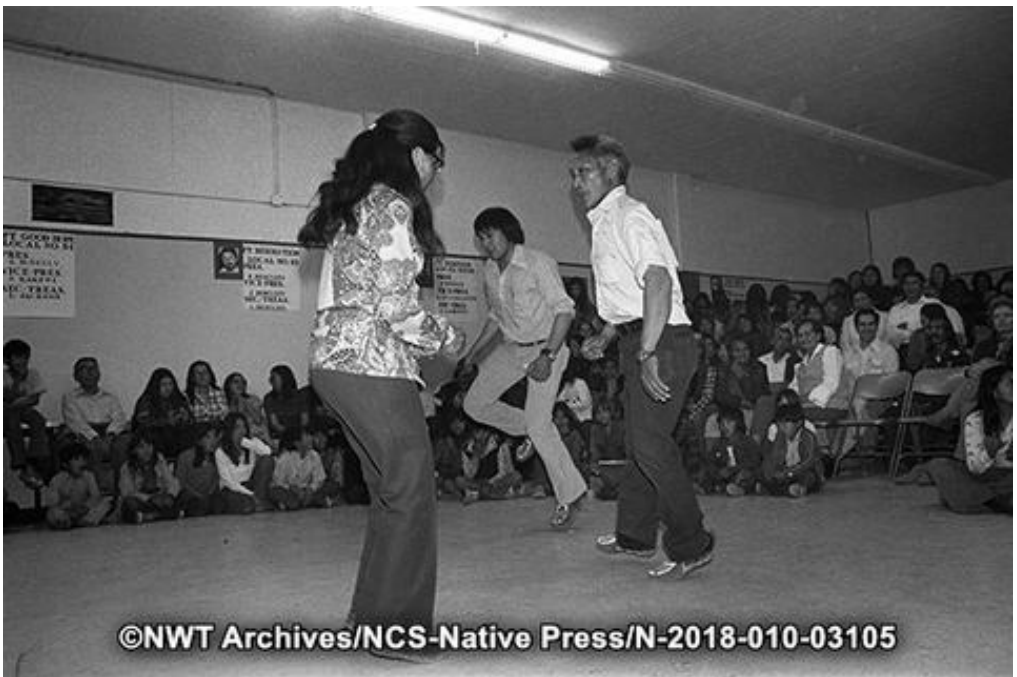
Fort Norman, August 1978. Drummers during Dene Assembly. Photo by Native Communications Society.



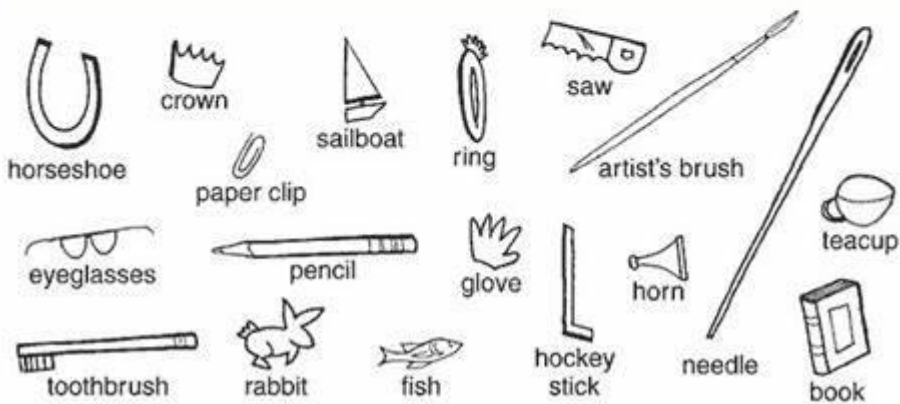
