In Bearlake, Slavey, and Mountain, all prefix-initial [r]'s derive from /d/. Some examples of [d]-[r] alternations are shown in (5).

The [d]-[r] alternation occurs only in conjunct prefixes. Disjunct prefixes never exhibit such alternations, as shown in (6) for incorporated postpositions (6a), adverbs (6b, 6c, 6d), and incorporated stems (6e).

This rule is common, even preferred, in Bearlake and Norman Mountain. It occurs less commonly in Slave. The weakening is often heard in Fort Simpson Slavey and not as frequently elsewhere.

This alternation most commonly occurs when the /d/ is not word-initial, as shown in the examples in (5). It can occur word-initially, as illustrated by the data in (7).

When two prefixes of the form de- are adjacent, only the /d/ of the rightmost prefix can become [r]. The rule scans from right to left and is non-iterative, affecting only the first /d/ it comes to.

When de- is followed by a prefix ne-, the /d/ can never become [r].

(9) kádenéyú*kárenéyú

's/he started to drive out'

The rule weakening d/d to [r] applies to an initial d/d of a conjunct prefix. It optionally weakens d/d to [r] if the initial consonant of the following syllable is non-coronal, or is not d, n, or r. [r] and [r] are permissible phonetic sequences in these dialects, unlike in Hare.

The rule of /d/ weakening is shown in (10).

where d is the initial consonant of a conjunct prefix

In Bearlake, the left hand environment of this rule is often extended so that the rule applies at a word boundary as well as word-internally.
