## 62 Part II. The Sound System

c. ʔegháɬaɰda	'you sg. work'
ʔeghálaeda	's/he works'

The first line of each pair shows a second person singular form, where the nasal of the second person singular raises the vowel /e/ of the preceding prefix. The fact that this vowel is /e/ can be seen by examining the second line of the pair, where no rule applies.

Other nasal-initial morphemes do not trigger raising. The *n*- conjugation marker does not, as in the examples in (28).

(28) a. tedéwé	's/he fell in water' (Hr, Bl)
/te # de + né = wé/	
b. ríyêshu	's/he places sg. object' (Hr)
/ní # ye + né = chu/	

Some nasals trigger raising, others do not. If there are two different nasals underlying, the differences in raising can be accounted for.

### 5.4.3 Perfective morpheme

The perfective morpheme is realized sometimes as the high vowel [i] and sometimes as a nasalized vowel [ɨ], as shown in (29).

(29) yiʔá	'I ate'
yɨʔá	's/he ate'

If this prefix has the qualities high and nasal, these different realizations can be accounted for.

### 5.4.4 Summary

There are two classes of *n*'s in Slave. The second person singular and the adjectival class marker fall in one class and other prefixes with an initial nasal fall in a second class. In the first of these classes of prefixes, the nasal fails to alternate with [r] and causes raising of /e/ to [i]. In the second class, the nasal alternates with [r] and fails to trigger raising. This type of evidence, along with the patterning of the perfective morpheme, suggests that [n] derives from two underlying sources, /n/ and /ñ/.

## 5.5 Continuants

Phonetically Slave has both voiced and voiceless continuants, as shown in (30) for the different dialects.

(30) f/th/wh	s	ɬ	sh	x
v/dh/w	z	l	zh	gh

[f, v] occur in Mountain, [th, dh] in Slavey, [wh,w] in Bearlake, and [w] alone in Hare.

### 5.5.1 Voicing alternations

There are voicing alternations between voiced and voiceless continuants in Slave, illustrated in (31) for nouns and (32) for verbs.

(31) seh	-zégé	'spit, saliva' (Hr)
shj	-yiné	'song' (Bl, Sl, Mt)
xéeh	-ghéelé	'pack'
te	-leré	'smoke' (Bl, Sl, Mt)
whe	-weé	'belt' (Bl)
tha-	-dhá	'mouth' (Sl)

(32) hehse	'I shout'	heze	's/he shouts'
rehshee	'I grow'	reyee	's/he grows' (Hr)
hehxa	'I lace (snowshoe)'	hegha	's/he laces'
hehji	'I am'	hji	's/he is' (Bl, Sl, Mt)
yenehwhę	'I want'	yenjwę	's/he wants' (Bl)
k'aohthe	'I am boss'	k'aodhe	's/he is boss' (Sl)
ehfa	'I carry pl. object'	eva	's/he carries pl.O' (Mt)

The voiceless continuant occurs word-initially (31) and, in verbs, following a voiceless consonant (32). This consonant can be the *h*- classifier, the first person singular subject marker *h*-, or the second person plural *ah*-. The voiced continuant occurs following a voiced segment, as in the possessed and third person forms in (31) and (32) respectively.

A voiced continuant also occurs in verbs with the *l*- classifier. This classifier has no phonetic form; its presence is apparent from the perfective paradigm and from morphosyntactic evidence. See chapter 24. When the *l*- classifier is present underlyingly, a voiced continuant occurs phonetically after a voiceless consonant. The presence of the *l*- classifier in the underlying representation allows the stem to begin with a voiced continuant. (33) shows examples of *l*- classifier verbs. While voiced continuants are expected in the third person, only when the *l*- classifier is present can voiced continuants appear in the first person singular.

(33) nánhée	'I hunt'	názée	's/he hunts' (Bl, Sl, Mt)
nágoheh	'I play'	nágoyeh	's/he plays' (Bl, Sl, Mt)
tu?ededehgha	'I throw myself into water'	tu?ededegha	's/he throws him/herself into water' (Hr)
tedénehwé	'I fell in water'	tedéwé	's/he fell in water' (Bl)

The words in (33) have phonetic voiced stem-initial continuants due to the presence of the *l*- classifier.

There are words in which voiced continuants are found word-initially.

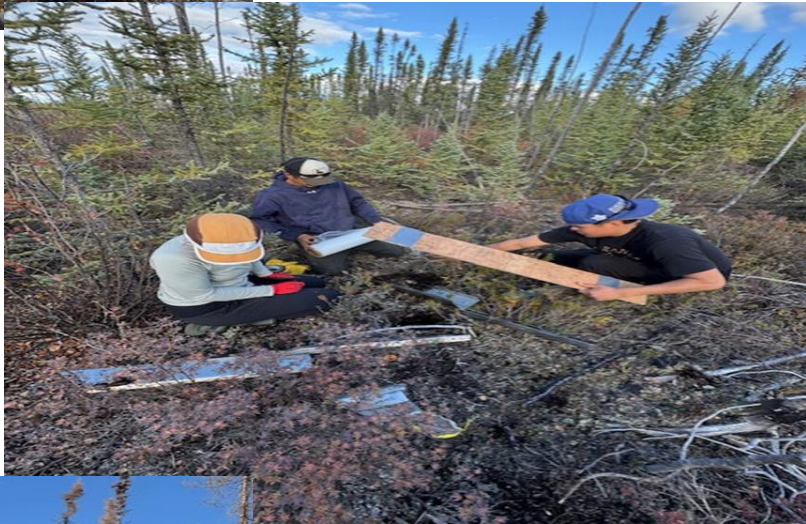
## Permafrost and Wellsite Sump Studies

September 2025

The IPCA provided resource assistance to Duane Froese from the University of Alberta< Department of Earth and Atmospheric Science during their summer field work in the Tulita area. Over a 3-day period from September 11-13, 2024, Andy Horassi and Matt Yakeleya accompanied the study team to install temperature monitoring stations, installed to 5-meter depth at sites representing different fire historical and disturbance types, and also investigate environmental impacts of historical oil and gas exploration drilling sump. The sites were located at Willow Lake and Stewart Lake area. This also included water sampling and mapping of the area.

# Stewart Lake Camp

September 7 – 15, 2025

The Indigenous Protected and Conserved Areas office held a Wilderness/ Survival land crisis preparedness and a shorten First Aid course at Stewart Lake from September 7-15, 2025.

A total of 32 people were in camp including 6 elders, 13 youth participants, 6 camp staff, 2 IPCA staff, 1 Course Instructor, and 4 family members





Adam Bathe from Blyth & Bathe delivered two training courses at the camp:

1. Wilderness First Aid, and
2. Wilderness Survival/Land Crisis

Preparedness

The instructor did a modified version of the Wilderness Crisis Management course. The first day, it was raining, so they leaned into some classroom first aid skills and then moved to doing wilderness scenarios on the second day. The third day of the WCM course is usually a long scenario where the students use all the skills discussed on the previous days (First Aid, Shelter, Heat, Signals, Water, Food, and Rescue).

The Wilderness First Aid covered the ABC's (airway, breathing & circulation) to the hymnic maneuver as well as other first aid techniques. The participants were able to identify critical situations along with demonstrating what they learned.

Coupled with the courses the participants engaged in hunting and fishing where some participants managed to harvest 5 caribou. Josh was able to get his first caribou, and donated his meat to the elders and many single mothers in the community. We also practiced and



performed Dene drum songs, storytelling and sharing circles on their experiences and highlights of the camp.

Ricky Andrew also assisted in emergency shelter building that participants showed their various skills in hands on building techniques.

Adam was also found a piece of chert within the camp area, that appeared worked and discarded. For reference, the hills in the Steward/Tate Lake area are home to chert that our ancestors collected and worked into cutting edges, arrow heads, spear points and axes, and was widely traded into Northern Alberta and the Yukon.

Adam contacted the Prince of Wales archeological section in Yellowknife as well as the Museum of Man in Ottawa to show them the chert and will return to us after consultation with them. This is exciting as this is our finger print on the land that our ancestors left behind, along with more recent evidence such as cabins (e.g, at Drum Lake).

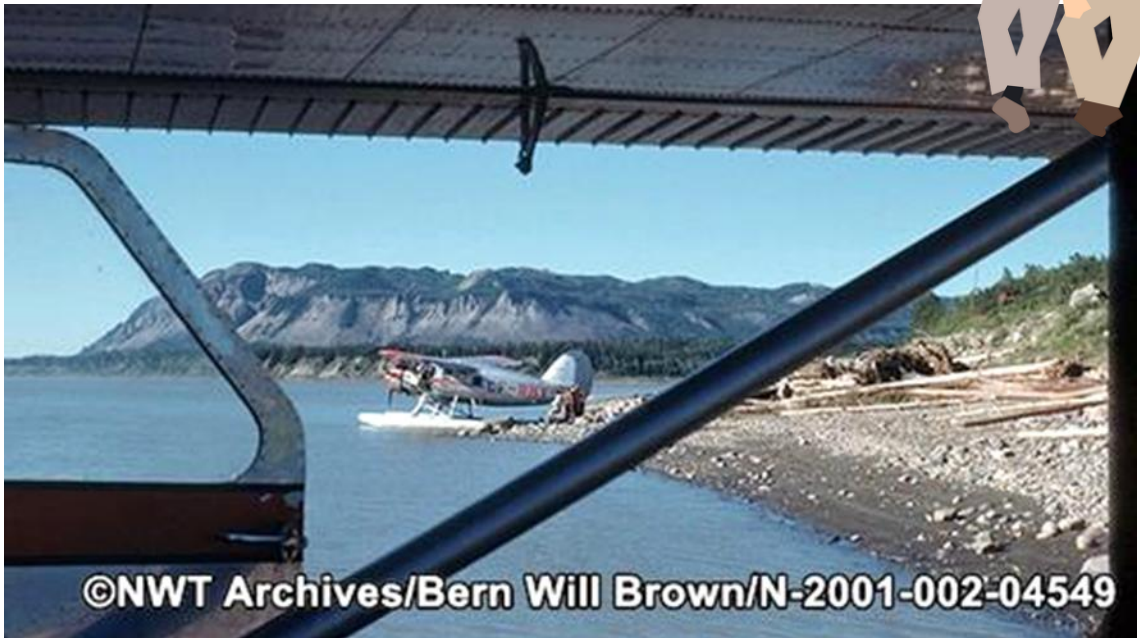

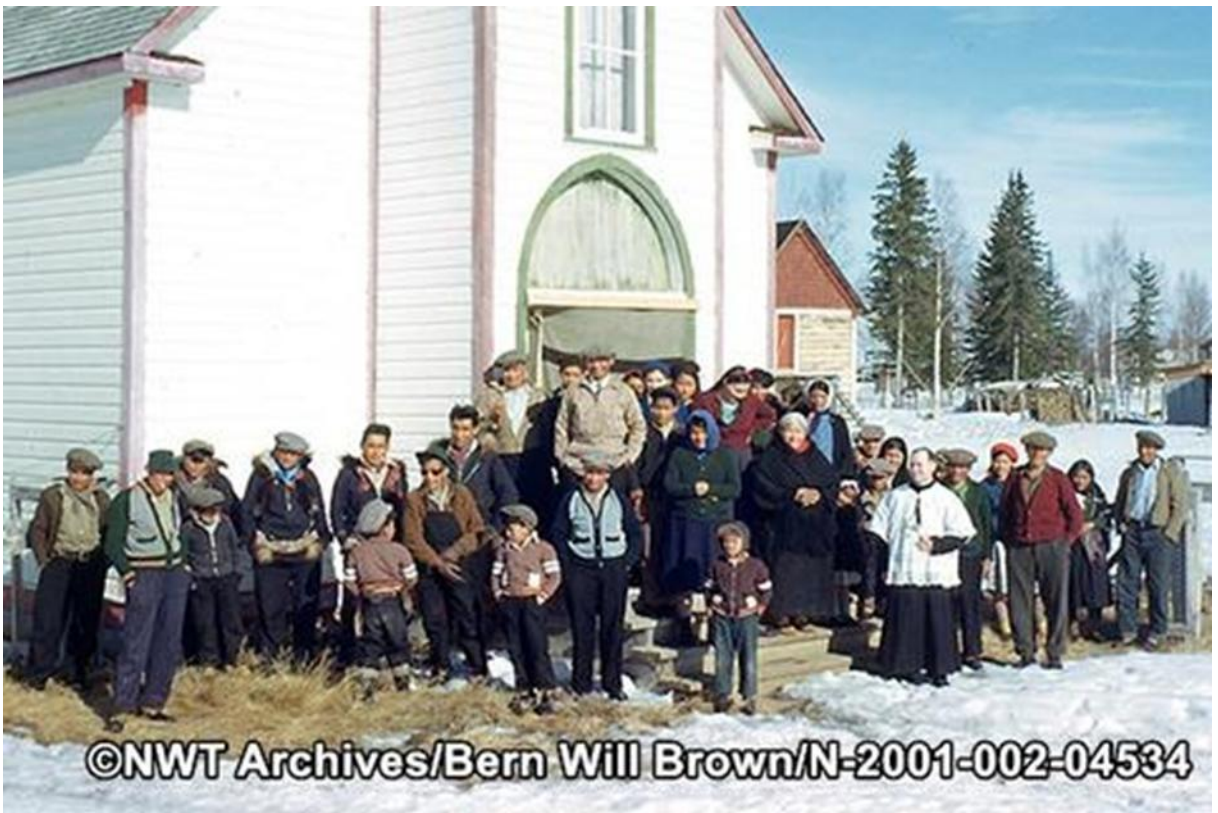

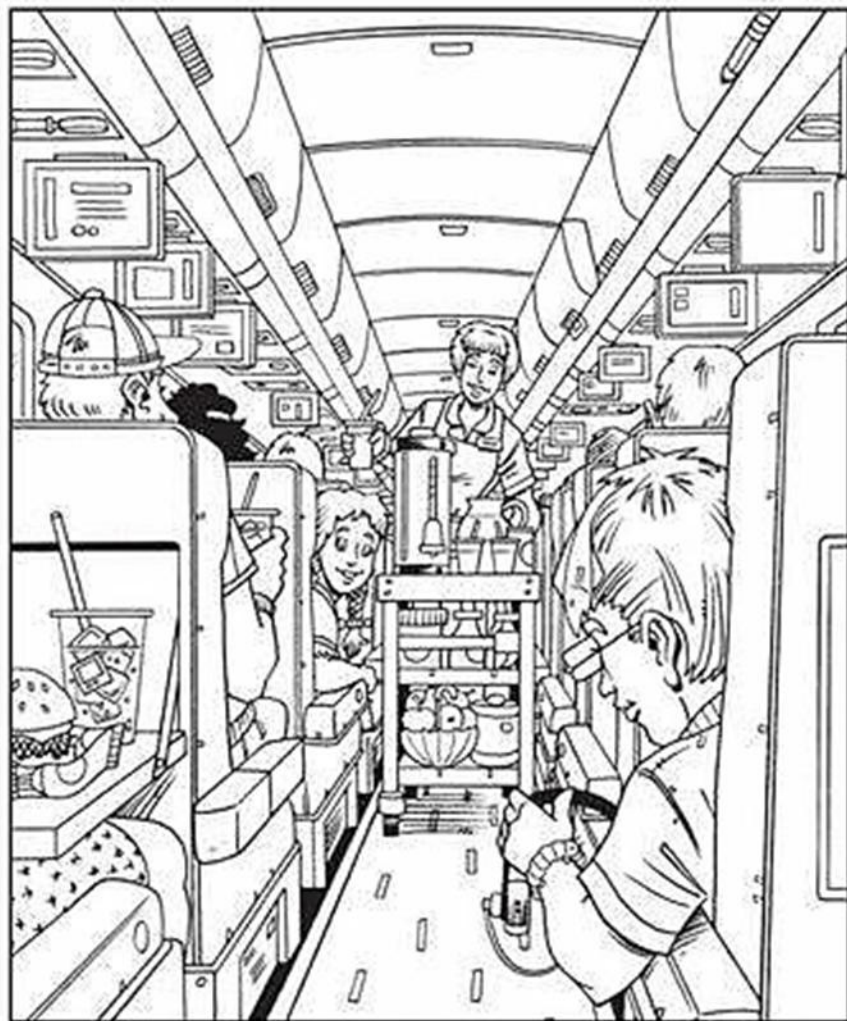
